Provides medical care to underserved people in the villages and towns of third world countries while educating local medical providers to the treatment of international diseases and illnesses specific to the region
Each trip sends doctors/dentist/optometrists, Pas, pharmacists, NPs, RNs, medical assistants and emergency medical technicians together to complete to goals and return with a deeper understanding of how to serve immigrant families in their medical communities.
